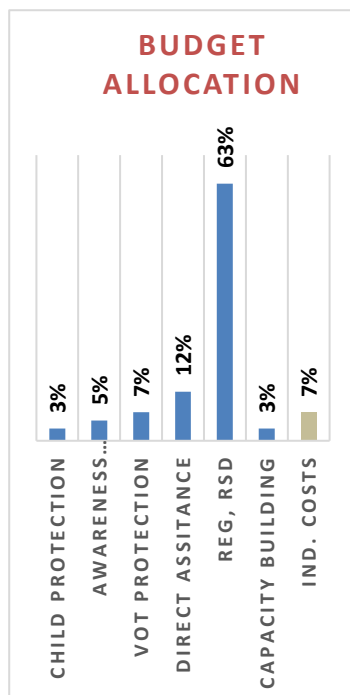

UNHCR Egypt faced a surge in new arrivals from Sudan approaching to seek registration and obtain UNHCR documentation. As a direct result, UNHCR registered and provided government recognized UNHCR documentation to 415,721 refugees and asylum seekers as well as continuous registration to 204,868 asylum seekers and refugees. UNHCR was able to surpass the target and finalized 18,676 individual RSD decisions. Moreover, UNHCR carried out capacity building for 369 government officials from the Ministries of Foreign Affairs, Justice, Interior, as well as the Diplomatic Corps and the National Council of Human Rights. Furthermore, UNHCR carried out specialized sessions to capacitate government actors on the border with regards to refugee law and international standard and sponsored 7 government officials to attend trainings facilitated by the IHL in Sanremo.

Save the Children offered services to 619 Unaccompanied and Separated Children, including individual and group mentorship session. A total of 228 UASC received MHPSS services and 230 UNASC received Emergency Cash. Education team assisted two Community Learning Centers in the delivery of quality Accelerated Learning Programs, Language Classes, Catch-Up Clubs. 318 students joined the three learning programs and SCI team also distributed to them 316 education kits.

The Youth and Adolescents team conducted an art-focused workshop attended by 54 youth, followed by a community awareness event that was attended by another 61. The team also supported four youth-led initiatives with 40 youth from different nationalities.



IOM supported the national authorities and relevant stakeholders to meet their commitments in combatting trafficking in persons and migrant smuggling through capacity building interventions, technical support and new prevention and awareness raising initiatives. IOM will start implementing the activities after obtaining the mandatory national security clearance from the Government of Egypt. The following accomplishments have been thus far achieved: finalization and submission of a detailed concept note and recommendations for the National Councils to enhance the data collection of victims of trafficking cases; Mapping of the operational and organizational capacity of the Community- Based Organizations and Delivery of essential items to a CBO which is receive a high number of Sudanese migrants; Design of a guidebook for community leaders for migrant's rights advocacy.
